i) Duration - These examinations are of 2.5 hrs . duration.
ii) Theory question paper pattern -

- There are five questions each of 15 marks.
- All questions are compulsory with internal choice within the questions.
- Questions may be subdivided into sub-questions $a, b, c \ldots$ and the allocation of marks depends on the weightage of the topic.
$>$ A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination together.

$>$ As per the UGC guidelines the University of Mumbai has introduced the new Choice Based Credit System with effect from the academic year 2016-17. A detailed description of the system is given for understanding of students as follows:

## SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

- B.Com: The performance of the Learners will be evaluated by one examination of 100 marks at the end of every Semester. (for Foundation Course subject Internal Assessment component carrying 25\% marks and the Semester End Examination component carrying $75 \%$ marks will be applicable.)
-All Self-Financed: The performance of the Learners will be evaluated in two Components. One component will be the Internal Assessment component carrying 25\% marks and the second component will be the Semester-wise End Examination component carrying 75\% marks.
- BSc (IT): The performance of the Learners will be evaluated in three components. One component will be Practical examination carrying $50 \%$ marks, the second component will be internal examination of $25 \%$ marks and third component will be Semester-wise End Examination component carrying 75\% marks.


## PASSING STANDARD:

B.Com: The Learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of $40 \%$ marks in aggregate for each course at the end of every Semester Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of $40 \%$ marks (i.e 40 marks out of 100) to pass the course and minimum of Grade D to pass a particular semester. The result of the Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the student passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V.

All Self-Financed: The Learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of $40 \%$ marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of $40 \%$ marks (i.e. 10 out of 25) in the Internal Assessment and $40 \%$ marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 30 out

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of 75) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade $D$ to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination together. The result of the Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the student passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V.

BSc (IT): A student is said to have passed if he/she secures $40 \%$ of marks allotted in each head of passing. Theory of 100 marks and TW/ Practical/Tutorial of 50 marks are treated as separate heads of passing. The student is said have passed Semester I if the student passes in all heads of passing of the Semester and is eligible to be admitted to Semester II irrespective of no. of heads of failure in the First Semester. A student is eligible for admission to Semester III if either the student passes Semesters I \& II or the student Fails in a combination of Theory and/or Practical taken in Semester I or Semester II or together. Where the total marks does not exceed 200. A student is eligible to be admitted
to Semester IV irrespective of no. heads of failure in the Third Semester. However the student has to clear Semesters I and II in order to appear for Semester IV examination. A student is eligible for admission to Semester V if either the student passes Semester III \& IV or the student fails in a combination of Theory and/or Practical taken in Semester III or Semester IV or together, where the total marks does not exceed 200. A student is eligible to be admitted to Semester VI irrespective of no. of heads of failure in the fifth Semester. The results of Semester VI should be kept in abeyance until the student clears Semesters III, IV and V in full.

## RULES FOR ADDITIONAL EXAMINATIONS:

$>$ If the learner is absent on medical ground or for any reason/emergency beyond the control of the learner, the learner must apply to the Head of the Institution giving the reason(s) for absence within 8 days of the conduct of the examination along with the necessary documents and testimonials.
$>$ If the learner is absent for participation in Inter Collegiate events, State or National or International level events, Training camp or coaching camp organized by authorized university or state or national or international bodies, NSS / NCC Events / Camps / cultural activities / sports activities / research festival or any other activities authenticated by the head of the institution, the head of the Institution shall generally grant permission to the learner to appear for the additional class test or assignment.

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$>$ The Head of the Institution, on scrutiny of the documents and testimonials, may grant the permission to the learner to appear for the additional examination.
$>$ The Additional Class Test (or Viva Voce examination) or Assignment must be conducted 15 days prior to the commencement of the Semester End Examination after following the necessary procedure and completing the formalities.

## RULES FOR ATKT EXAMINATIONS:

$>$ Student will be allowed to keep term (ATKT) in Third Year only if he/she fails in not more than Two Subjects in each of semester I and semester II of First Year. He/she must have passed Second Year semester III and semester IV in full.
> Student will be allowed to keep term (ATKT) in Third Year only if he/she fails in not more than Two Subjects in each of semester III and semester IV of Second Year. He/she must have passed First Year semester I and semester II in full.
> Student will not be allowed to keep term in Third year if he/she fails in any of the subject of First Year and also in any of the subject of Second Year (Cross ATKT).
