





- 100% respondents agreed that the syllabus is considered suitable by a majority of faculties, and also the course content aligns with appropriate reference materials.
- 100% respondents agreed that the course has effectively expanded students' knowledge and perspective, and also the prescribed/reference materials relevant, updated, and appropriate.
- 92% respondents agreed the syllabus is need-based, and also The course design is seen as aligned with industrial requirements
- 96% respondents agreed the syllabus the aims and objectives of the syllabi are well-defined and clear, and also the presence of sufficient optional papers.
- A balanced approach between theory and practical components is perceived by a notable percentage of teachers 88%.
- 76% of teachers perceive the curriculum as aligned with students' career opportunities, while dissenting opinions exist among 4% and 20% remains neutral.



- Curriculum Comprehensibility: 65.09% find the curriculum easy to understand.
- Semester Pattern Convenience: 67.98% believe the semester pattern is convenient.
- Effective Curriculum Coverage: 59.43% feel the curriculum is adequately covered each semester.
- Advanced Subject Knowledge: 58.12% think the curriculum imparts advanced subject knowledge.
- Practical Knowledge through Projects: 65.72% find opportunities for practical knowledge through projects.
- Curriculum's Relevance to Job Opportunities: 58.17% believe the curriculum helps provide job opportunities.

- Relevance of Syllabus: 98% of alumni agree the syllabus was relevant to their professional life.
- Value-Based Learning: 98% agree the syllabus imparted value-based learning.
- Knowledge Acquisition and Practical Orientation: 97.2% feel the syllabus meets expectations for knowledge acquisition and practical orientation.

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- Knowledge Acquisition and Practical Orientation: 97.2% feel the syllabus meets expectations for knowledge acquisition and practical orientation.
- Industry-Academia Gap Bridging: 92.3% confirm good academic initiatives bridging the industry-academia gap.
- Evaluation Methods: 95.2% rate course evaluation methods as very good.
- Promotion of Graduate Attributes: 96.1% believe the syllabus promotes graduate attributes.
- Library Facilities: Majority agree on availability of reading material (92.3%), better internet services (92.3%), and a conducive environment (92.4%).
- Access to Resources: 94.3% can access online study materials from the library, and 91.4% can access
 the library on holidays.
- Sports and Recreation: Mixed opinions on sports facilities; 88.5% say indoor/outdoor games aren't organized, but 91.4% had access to sports equipment and participation opportunities.

Report 2022-23

Employer's Feedback

- Technical Proficiency, Leadership Abilities, and Innovation: A substantial portion of respondents (96.77%) strongly agree that Curriculum helps students to possess the requisite technical knowledge, skills, and leadership competencies. Only 3.23% remain neutral.
- 100% of the respondents agree that the curriculum helps in Promoting Creativity among Students.
- Student Participation in Social Activities: Feedback indicates that 70.97% of respondents strongly believe that students actively engage in social activities. While a noteworthy portion (29.03%) remain neutral on this matter.
- 70.97% of respondents strongly believe that the students show Willingness to Extend Work Hours When Necessary. 29.03% maintain a neutral standpoint.

Teacher's Feedback

- 100% of respondents agreed that the syllabus is considered suitable by a majority of faculties, and also the course content aligns with appropriate reference materials.
- 100% of respondents agreed that the course has effectively expanded students' knowledge and perspective, and also the prescribed/reference materials are relevant, updated, and appropriate.
- 76% of teachers perceive the curriculum as aligned with students' career opportunities, while dissenting opinions exist among 4% and 20% remain neutral.

Student's Feedback

- Semester Pattern Convenience: A majority (67.98%) of students believe that the semester pattern is convenient for learning, comprising 15.72% who strongly agree and 51.26% who agree. Only a minor 2.52% strongly disagree.
- Teaching Methodology: A total of 67.29% of students find the teaching methodology easy to understand, comprising 21.38% who strongly agree and 45.91% who agree. Minimal disagreement is expressed (6.98%).
- Availability of Reading Material: A significant 70.44% of students find reading materials available (19.18% strongly agree, 51.26% agree), but 6.92% express concerns.
- Curriculum's Relevance to Job Opportunities: While 58.17% of students believe that the curriculum helps provide job opportunities, a noticeable 12.95% express scepticism (17.92% strongly agree, 40.25% agree, 12.95% disagree).

Alumni's Feedback

- 98 % of alumni agree Syllabus studied by you was relevant to your professional life. Only 2% didn't agree with the above statement.
- 98% of alumni agree Syllabus imparted value-based learning in terms of skills, concepts, knowledge & critical thinking. Only 2% didn't agree with the above statement.

91.3% of the alumni said that cleanliness is maintained in the college.

 24% of teachers perceive the curriculum needs to be aligned with the student's career opportunities.

Hence the institution suggested a Certificate course in advanced Java with full-stack

The institution suggested conducting the Personality Enhancement & Soft Skill Development Programme Certificate course

 11.95% of the students were unsatisfied with the given syllabus and were not useful in providing job opportunities.

The college conducted a Certificate Program in Corporate Communication and Industry Interface

• 5.71% of the Alumni were not satisfied with the Cleanliness in college.
